#### The purpose of the tool

- To define what the ecosystem aims at and why
- Outcomes: Ecosystem purpose, goals, values and themes

### Suggestions for preparatory assignments

Pre-work 1: Think about the challenges and opportunities that the ecosystem partners could solve or seize as an opportunity together

#### Recommended workshop setup

Face-to-face workshop recommended; online workshop possible



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#### Assets needed

Printed canvases for a face-to-face workshop (size A1 or A0 on the wall and printed personal A4 worksheets for all participants) OR online canvas(es) (e.g. Miro or Padlet)



#### Other hints and tips

This tool can be used in different phases of the ecosystem lifecycle to refine the purpose and goals as the ecosystem evolves

## Instructions

#### How to prepare for the exercise

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Send a calendar invitation to a 2.5-3-hour workshop

Send an e-mail to all workshop participants one week before the scheduled event and ask them to identify, as a pre-assignment, high-level challenges or opportunities that they would be interested in solving or seizing opportunity with others in the ecosystem

Ask all participants to present their pre-work outcomes at the workshop

#### How to run the workshop

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Work in one big group to identify common challenges / opportunities for the ecosystem. Ask each participant to write their pre-defined challenges/opportunities on post-it notes and to place their stickies on the canvas on the wall. Discuss through the identified challenges/ opportunities. Vote or grade the most important ones and select the opportunities that the ecosystem wants to seize together.

- Define common values for the ecosystem (what are the values we stand for?)
- Discus

Discuss and define themes of common interest (what topics are we interested in solving together?)

- Agree on common goals (what do we want to achieve together?)
- Summarize the common purpose (why we are here as an ecosystem?)
- Document the defined common purpose and themes of common interest and share the summary document with the participants

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
